## Car crashes are a leading cause of death for children ages 1-13.

---

- Roughly every 30 seconds, a car crash involving a child under 13 occurs.
- In 2017, 675 children under the age of 13 were killed in car accidents. That's nearly two per day.

## Car seats can dramatically increase your child's chance of survival in a serious crash.

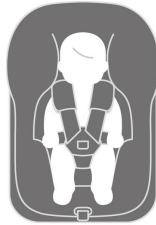
---

- In passenger cars, car seats **reduce the risk** of fatal injury for infants **by 71%** and for toddlers **by 54%**.
- In light trucks, car seats reduce the risk of fatal injury for infants **by 58%** and for toddlers **by 59%**.
- In 2017, car seats saved the lives of an estimated **312 children** under the age of 5.

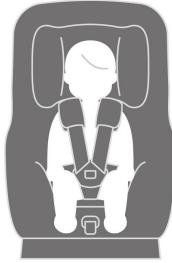


# Know Your Car Seats

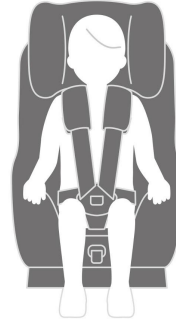

- Rear-facing car seats (example: Seats A and B in depiction above) are recommended for children under a year old up to age 3.
- Forward-facing car seats (example: Seat C in depiction above) are recommended for children between the ages of 1-7, or until they reach the height and weight limit allowed by the manufacturer.
- Booster seats (example: Seat D in depiction above) are recommended for children between the ages of 4-12, or until they fit a seat belt properly.





## Know Your Car Seats

---

- Once your child has graduated from the booster seat, it is important to keep them in the back seat until at least age 13!

- Make sure your child's car seat is up-to-code: every state has [different legal requirements](#).
- Learn the expiration date of your child's car seat: car seats should be replaced every 6-10 years.
